## ALABAMA WINNERS OF NATIONAL STUDENT WRITING COMPETITION ANNOUNCED

Results of the 2009 Alabama Letters About Literature contest have been announced by the Alabama Center for the Book. The winning entries were selected from among almost 600 entries submitted by students in grades four through twelve across the state. In Alabama, the competition is sponsored by the Alabama Center for the Book, part of the College of Liberal Arts at Auburn University, and by the Alabama Humanities Foundation. National sponsors are the Center for the Book in the Library of Congress and Target Stores.

Letters About Literature is a national reading-writing contest in which student readers write a personal letter to an author, living or dead, from any genre—fiction or nonfiction, contemporary or classic—explaining how that author's work changed the student's way of thinking about the world or themselves. Letters are judged first at the state level. First-place winners from state competitions across the country are then submitted to the national contest, where six winners will be chosen to receive \$10,000 reading promotion grants for their school or community library.

Alabama winners will be recognized in an awards ceremony at the Alabama Book Festival on April 18, 2009, at Old Alabama Town in Montgomery. Each winning student will receive books and a certificate from the Alabama Center for the Book. The first-place winner in each level will also receive a \$50 gift card from Target Stores.
